225 Years Young!

We are still looking for some volunteers to help plan a celebration of our 225th anniversary. 2018 is the 225th anniversary of the Lutheran Church in the Linglestown area. The date that has been gleaned from a past anniversary booklet has the date of November 21 as the official anniversary of our congregation. The Church Council has talked about this event during several meetings and is now seeking someone or some group of the church who may be interested in planning something special for the anniversary. There has been some informal conversation taking place but we are still in need of a few folks organizing a celebration. We are half way through the year and still are looking for some ideas and assistance to plan something. It may just be a special worship service that would take place on November 18th. If you are interested in planning or helping to organize a celebration, please speak to the Council President Ken Stank or contact Pastor Kerns.

The Lutherans incorporated their church in 1793 at Wenrich's Church which is now where St. Thomas UCC church is located. The Lutherans then constructed the current building in 1951-1952 and the new church was named Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church. At the 200th anniversary, the congregation embarked on a

fund raising program asking members for their participation in making our church building accessible to all who wish to enter and worship. What will the 225th anniversary bring our way?

John 6:35 – Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty."

In the Lord's Prayer we ask God to "Give us today our daily bread." Jesus reminds us that he is the true bread that feeds our lives and souls. Daily we partake of Jesus through prayer and Scripture, and as often as we may through Holy Communion. (Stewardship of Life online)

The Revised Common Lectionary for year B, which we are in right now, will lead us to what is called the Bread of Life series from our gospel readings from St. John.

John 6:35, from above, is part of the series that is coming up beginning at the end of July and continues for five weeks through August. We will begin on July 29 with the feeding of the five thousand where there was plenty of bread and fish to go around for the crowd and there were twelve baskets of leftovers. This may be a time for us to consider our stewardship for the life of the church as we recognize that Jesus is "The Bread of Life" for all of us.

ABUNDANCE

I read in the July "Living Lutheran" about the abundance that was shown in the Biblical Story about the feeding of the 5,000. One interesting point that stood out for me was in the midst of church declining membership there is still abundance. That is God's abundance and that abundance can come from many different avenues but the reality is that we all live with abundance. Even if we only have two fish and five loaves we still have abundance in what God has given us. The article also talked about what the future may hold and that our church buildings and our institutions in the church may all go by the wayside and we will still have the abundance of God given to us.

What is abundance for one person may not be for another, at least in their thinking. But I want to consider the feeding of the 5,000 and the giving of the fish and bread and when all had eaten their fill there were twelve baskets of leftovers. Jesus knew what he was going to do even before the disciples or those gathered knew. When we give of our abundance, we are sharing what God has first given us.

We have been generous with our giving to the ministries that we support. I ask that you continue to give of your abundance for the life and mission of the church. At our monthly breakfasts, we give at least half of the free will offering to go to some hunger related ministry. We sit and eat but we also give so that others may have something to eat as well. God's kingdom has come near in Jesus and it comes near every time we are willing to give of our abundance to the work of the church.

In a recent sermon, I mentioned going to serve with the Helping Hands group at St. Michael's Lutheran Church in Harrisburg. The people who come for a meal come hungry and leave filled. This past time there was plenty of abundance on the table but that is not always the case. But there is something to eat and that in of itself can be considered enough.

I invite all of you to become involved in the ministries of our church. Share your abundance

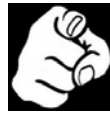
SAVE THE DATE!
